CD Breshears

CD was born and raised in the Treasure Valley and graduated from Vallivue High School in 1998. He attended Boise State University in 2000 but enlisted in the United States Marine Corps in 2003, where he served as an Infantry Squad Leader until 2007. After serving his country, CD returned to Boise State and earned a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration and Human Resource Management in 2011, while also serving in the Idaho Air National

Guard. In 2013, CD continued his career of service by recruiting for the Idaho Air National Guard for two years before becoming the High School Admissions Consultant with Stevens-Henager College in 2015. Also in 2015, CD started two distinctly different businesses, leveraging the talent and experience of his wife, Ashley as Operations Director. He recently completed his Master's Degree in Entrepreneur with Independence University. In late 2016, CD was offered an amazing position with the State of Idaho, Department of Education to run a federal grant called GEAR UP. GEAR UP gave CD the opportunity to see the public side of Idaho's education system and he was able to collaborate with all Idaho colleges and universities. After a year and a half with the state, CD was given the opportunity to return to Stevens-Henager in a role that allowed him to work as an agent of the state, and aligning Stevens-Henager's private education to the governor's 60% college completion goal.

CD is passionate about helping Idaho teens find their own passions and link it to career paths, from volunteering with the Idaho Youth Challenge Academy, to networking with programs like Life's Kitchen, RISE (Treasure Valley's Educational Partnership) and the Educate Idaho Network. His dream is to increase Idaho's college graduation rates by educating teens, teachers and counselors on the advantages of Career and Technical Education and individualized career advocacy.



CONFERENCE GUIDELINES

ADVISER / CHAPERONE RESPONSIBILITIES

- Advisers and chaperones are responsible for the behavior of their students throughout the conference.
- Advisers are responsible for enforcing the Idaho SLC dress code.
- Advisers are responsible for enforcing the 11:00 p.m. student curfew.

Delegates are expected to attend and participate in <u>all</u> meeting sessions. All conference attendees should be informed of the following:

- Name badges are required for admission and must be worn when attending sessions and the dance.
- Please be on time for all sessions and remain until sessions are adjourned.
- Wristbands for the FCCLA Banquet <u>must be worn</u> to this event without exception.
- Behavior at all times should be such that it reflects a positive, professional image of you, your school, your state and the organization.
- Be considerate of sleeping hours and the privacy of other hotel quests and FCCLA members. All students will observe an 11:00 p.m. curfew.
- Any accidents, injuries, or illnesses should be reported to the adult chaperone or adviser immediately. State staff should be informed of such incidents.

TRAVEL SAFETY TIPS

- When going outside the hotel never travel alone and always walk in public, well-lit areas.
- Use your common sense about safety and always let your adviser know where you are going.
 Keep the cell phone numbers of your advisers and friends handy,

- in case you need to reach each other quickly.
- Avoid being out after dark unless you are with an adult chaperone.
- Do not give money to strangers.
- Remove name badges when outside the hotel and conference facility.
- Never give your hotel room number to anyone you do not know.
- Bolt your hotel room door. Only open it when you know who is on the other side.
- Note: All hotel personnel wear uniforms and have an identification badge. If in doubt, call the hotel security to come and verify the employee's identity.
- Know where the stairs are located in case of a fire. Count the number of doors to the nearest exit in case you can't see in a smoke filled hallway. Do not use the elevators.

WHAT SHOULD I DO IF...

- ... I lost my room key? A new room key can be issued at the front desk. Be sure to bring your identification, like a driver's license or other photo ID
- ... the fire alarm goes off? If the fire alarm goes off, and you are in your sleeping room, you should refer to the emergency map on the back of your door for the nearest exit. Please check the door for heat

before opening. You may want to designate a particular area outside the hotel for your chapter/group to meet. If there are any attendees that need special assistance, please compile a list for the front desk so they can help.

- ... I need to call security? Simply dial "0" and the hotel operator will connect you.
- ... my wallet or other valuables are missing? Report missing items to security by dialing "0". You should also let your adviser know. In addition, you may want to check in at the FCCLA Registration Desk.
- ... I don't feel well? First, contact your adviser. If there is a real emergency, dial "0" for assistance.

Often, we can fix it! We can always try to help fix it! We will usually make it better by trying to fix it! Letting fear dominate our thinking only makes things worse. If we don't let fear paralyze us we can do a lot more than we might think... A teenage girl lifts a 7000 pound truck to rescue her dad! A thirteen-year-old rescues seventeen people on an air mattress during Hurricane Harvey! Teens mow lawns for free to help those who can't do it themselves! A man reveals his plan to do violence as a teenager, and how his friend's kindness stopped him! A survivor of extreme bullying creates an app that helps kids stay connected and never alone! These and other stories are woven together with music and sports action on three giant screens to create a fun and inspirational message of empowerment!

Here and Now You hear it over and over again: "You are the future", or, "Think about your future!" Those are extremely important things to keep in mind, but we are living in the present, and the best thing we can do for our future is to step up and take on challenges that we share here and now.

Students will be challenged by:

Jacy Good, who struggles with disabilities after losing lost her parents at the hands of a distracted driver who hit them all on the day of her graduation. Ryan Warneke, who chooses to be an inspiring warrior against cystic fibrosis rather than a passive victim. Amy Walker, who as a child was told she would never walk and is deaf and blind in one eye, yet became a gymnast on the number one team in the NCAA. Young basketball players who stop play to take a stand against bullying by an opposing fan who is mocking a very special cheerleader. Music, sports and movie clips are woven together with these and other stories to inform and inspire, delivering a high impact experience!


