STAR Events (*Students Taking Action with Recognition*) is a program of Family, Career and Community Leaders of America (FCCLA) that builds student’s leadership and career-related skills at the local, regional, state, and national levels.



Participants from Idaho said:

In 2017-2018, **305** students completed **192** projects, reaching approximately **38,141** people

Why did we compete in STAR Events?

Participants from Idaho joined over 20,000 students competing in STAR Events. Students reported participating to increase leadership skills, to apply college and career-readiness skills to future goals, to meet personal, school, or community needs, and to learn and have fun!

How useful are STAR Events for my future?

Idaho students reported, along with 90% of all national participants, that these events are very or extremely useful as they prepare for future experiences.
